

Behavior Consultant

PROGRAM: Intensive Behavioral Health Services (IBHS)

COUNTIES: Chester, Cumberland/Perry, Dauphin, Lancaster, Lebanon, and York

Description:

Provide behavior consultation services to children, youth or young adults and families in settings other than a provider agency and office, including the child's home, foster home, school, and/or other community settings. Services provided include designing and directing the implementation of an individualized treatment plan to meet the child/youth/young adult and family needs. During treatment, assess and identify behavioral goals and intervention techniques that the treatment team implements.

Responsibilities:

- Maintain on-going communication and collaboration with all team members.
- Develop behavior/treatment plan and/or crisis plans with the child, family, and team that are developmentally appropriate and strengths based.
- Develop and monitor intervention techniques as a part of treatment planning and to assess the effectiveness of these interventions through collaboration with the therapeutic team.
- Complete initial and on-going assessment of consumer and families' needs and strengths.
- Attend interagency meetings to coordinate design of treatment plan and IBHS recommendations.
- Complete all required documentation in a thorough and accurate manner.
- Follow-up with frequent observations of consumer and school/family to ensure consistency according to developmental requirements.
- Monitor the implementation of treatment interventions with team members ongoing and update treatment plans accordingly.
- Participate in identifying discharge planning and discharge planning goals for child(ren) and families.
- Observe and oversee BHT and family to ensure interventions and goals are being implemented appropriately.
- Travel to a variety of education and/or home environments to provide services in the consumer's natural environment.

- Complete all necessary documentation related to consumer cases including Psychological Feedback Form, Assessment, Individual treatment plan, and progress notes.
- Ensure compliance with Ponessa's policies and procedures including confidentiality and mandated reporting.
- Maintain supervision requirements with BHT's as required.
- Provide clinical information to the evaluator as required or requested.
- Attend and participate in meetings and training programs as required.
- Provide supervision (both Group and Individual) to BHT's weekly.

Staff Leadership:

- Fosters a strengths based, trauma-informed, accountable, committed and motivated environment.
- Establishes and holds direct reports responsible to create a climate that attracts, retains and motivates high performance.
- Ensures the caliber of diverse staff with skills appropriate to meet the needs of those served.
- Models Ponessa's core competencies holding staff accountable to do the same.

Team Leadership:

- Demonstrate ability to communicate effectively and efficiently with all internal and external stakeholders.
- Cooperates and communicates as a multi-discipline staff team member through formal meetings, informal consultations and committee participation.
- Models traits of a responsible team member, executing job responsibilities, open communication, good follow through; supports team members to do the same.
- Demonstrates use and support of the trauma informed model in all aspects of employment, including interactions with consumers/students, family members, other employees, community members, and stakeholders.
- Responds promptly to the concerns and interests of the consumers, parents, guardians, funding entities and other Ponessa staff.

Partnerships and Collaborative Relationships:

• Establishes and maintains relationships with provider organizations, regulatory and licensing representatives, and referral sources, establishing effective and productive working relationships while promoting Ponessa.

Contributing to the Team:

 Participates in regular meetings with staff to ensure priorities are clear, coordination is good and communications are open. Develops additional methods for ongoing effective communication.

- Cooperates and communicates as a multi-discipline staff team member through formal meetings, informal consultations and committee participation.
- Models traits of a responsible team member, executing job responsibilities, open communication, good follow through; supports team members to do the same.
- Responds promptly to the concerns and interests of the consumers, parents, guardians, funding entities and other Ponessa staff.

Trauma Informed Behavior:

- Demonstrates commitment to being trauma informed and maintaining a therapeutic environment and community that promotes safety and nonviolence as the basis for all we do with clients and staff.
- Demonstrates knowledge and utilization of trauma informed practices, including emotional intelligence, effective communication, understanding of impact of trauma on development, strengths based and person-centered practice, resilience focus and commitment to growth and change.

Administrative Activities:

- Ensures compliance with all Ponessa policies and procedures, including confidentiality and acting as a mandated reporter in accordance with the law, policies, and procedures.
- Implements all documentation requirements, reports are complete, thorough, timely, and follow prescribed format.
- Other duties as assigned.

SKILLS:

- Behavior modification theory and application.
- Ability to utilize collaborative, team oriented approach.
- Knowledge and understanding of CASSP Principles.
- Social/ecological theory and application.
- Understanding of child and family development.
- Crisis intervention and management.
- Knowledge of DSM-5.
- Basic knowledge/understanding of common psychotropic medications.
- Experience working with diverse populations.

EXPERIENCE:

 Have 1 year full time experience in providing mental health services to child/youth/young adults if not licensed as a behavior specialist, have a BCBA certification, graduate degree in ABA, or completed a clinical or mental health practicum through a graduate program.

EDUCATION REQUIREMENT:

Individuals who provide individual services through behavior consultation services must meet one of the following:

- (1) Be licensed in this Commonwealth as a behavior specialist.
- (2) Have a certification as a BCBA or other graduate-level certification in behavior analysis that is accredited by the National Commission for Certifying Agencies or the American National Standards Institute.
- (3) Have a graduate degree in ABA from a college or university accredited by an agency recognized by the United States Department of Education or the Council for Higher Education Accreditation or have an equivalent degree from a foreign college or university that has been evaluated by the Association of International Credential Evaluators, Inc. or the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services. The Department will accept a general equivalency report from the listed evaluator agencies to verify a foreign degree or its equivalency.
- (4) Have a minimum of 1 year of full-time experience in providing mental health direct services to children, youth or young adults and a graduate degree in psychology, social work, education, or counseling from a college or university accredited by an agency recognized by the United States Department of Education or the Council for Higher Education Accreditation or an equivalent degree from a foreign college or university that has been evaluated by the Association of International Credential Evaluators, Inc. or the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services. The Department will accept a general equivalency report from the listed evaluator agencies to verify a foreign degree or its equivalency.
- (5) Completed a clinical or mental health direct service practicum and have a graduate degree in psychology, social work, education, counseling or a related field from a college or university accredited by an agency recognized by the United States Department of Education or the Council for Higher Education Accreditation or have an equivalent degree from a foreign college or university that has been evaluated by the Association of International Credential Evaluators, Inc. or the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services. The Department will accept a general equivalency report from the listed evaluator agencies to verify a foreign degree or its equivalency.

Individuals who provide behavior consultation services to children diagnosed with ASD for the treatment of ASD shall be licensed in this Commonwealth as a psychologist, professional counselor, marriage and family therapist, clinical social worker, social worker, behavior specialist, certified registered nurse practitioner or a professional with a scope of practice that includes overseeing the provision of ABA services.
